Thank you to all our members who entered for the Spar virtual race. we finished with 150 entries.



We plan to give all the entrants the opportunity to do their run/walk from the club house on 4 September if they so wish. We will keep you posted.



ABOUT JUMPING KIDS

Technology has come a long way to enable amputees.

Most young South Africans living with amputation are limited more by health policies and the high cost of prosthetic equipment than by their actual physical ability. At Jumping Kids, the dream is to provide affordable prosthetic solutions geared for optimum results while boosting awareness and advocating for change. It is not enough to merely fit a child with a prosthetic. We believe access to the equipment should translate into access to better education and sport. This is achieved by following a multi-disciplinary approach to ensure the children's long-term reintegration as valuable members of society.

Jumping Kids Is Ability!

The technology and expertise required to assist young South Africans living with lower limb amputations already exists.

There is a new way of prosthetic manufacture that does not compromise on quality. A below knee prosthetic is made in four steps using eight components while actual fitment can take as little as 45 minutes.

This revolutionary method – combined with a holistic approach to rehabilitation – present children living with amputations with a new lease on life and a chance to shine.

Potential candidates are referred. Once part of the program, beneficiaries remain on it for a minimum period of one year during which regular consultations are necessary to ensure continued optimal performance.


Currently Jumping Kids works with close to 80 children, aged 1 to 18, from Gauteng, North West Province, Mpumalanga, Kwazulu-Natal, Western Cape, Zimbabwe and Gabon.

The initiative is supported by the generosity of volunteers, sponsors, donors, organisations and friends that include some of the country's top athletes.

Securing the funds necessary to service the children currently part of the program is an ongoing challenge. Jumping Kids relies on corporate social investment to achieve its mandate.

Ultimately, our goal is to support child amputees throughout their formative years to the completion of high school. We believe that access to prosthetic equipment should translate into access to quality education.

Access to sport is another important pillar of the Jumping Kids vision. Our kids are encouraged to participate and access to para-sport at the highest level has produced many success stories. The dream is to establish a Center of Excellence focused on sport as reintegration tool. The bigger dream is to expand our vision and to make affordable prosthetic solutions and methods available to more children in Africa by engaging in knowledge-transfer initiatives with representatives from the SADC region.
